

# 2021 SCNB Fall Skate

## Information & Logistics

Sanctioned by Skate Canada New Brunswick



# 1. General Information

---

2021 Fall Skate will be livestreamed with remote officiating (officials are off-site).

- Should officials not be available, the skaters will be filmed on those days and judged at a later date.
- Should province-wide restrictions not allow us to host a competition, the skaters will be filmed at their club.

This competition is open to NB residents only.

## Event Categories

- Skater(s) may be disqualified from the competition if entered in the wrong age level and/or category.
- Categories may be cancelled for logistical constraints.
- Registration numbers may be limited.
- Any decision to restrict or cancel categories will be communicated accordingly.

## 2. Eligibility – Test and age pre-requisites

---

Competitors wishing to enter events must meet the following test and age prerequisites/deadlines:

### COMPETITIVESKATE STREAM

Test requirements

Before October 1st preceding the competition

Age requirement

Before July 1st preceding the competition

### STARSKATE

Test requirements

Before midnight of the closing date of entries

Age requirement

Under 19 before July 1st preceding the competition

### PRE-JUVENILE AND JUVENILE

Test requirements

Before midnight of the closing date of entries

Age requirement

Before July 1st preceding the competition

**Any skater entered in an age-restricted category for which they are not age-qualified may be disqualified and changes will not be permitted after the start of the competition. Entry fees shall not be refunded.**

## 3. Selection of Skating Stream Policy

---

Competitive skaters who compete at SCNB Fall Skate and/or SCNB Sectional Championships in any discipline (Pre-Novice to Senior) are not eligible to compete in any STARSkate category within the same skating season. Competitive skaters wishing to change to the STARSkate stream will only be able to do so at SCNB Spring Skate.

STARSkaters (including Pre-Juvenile and Juvenile) who wish to move to a Competitive category may do so at any time during the skating season. In doing so, they are no longer eligible to compete in STARSkate categories at all remaining events of season, including Provincial STARSkate Championships.

## **4. Coaches Accreditation**

---

All Coaches who attend competitions in the Section of New Brunswick **MUST** wear their accreditation tag at all times.

Upon arrival at the competition, all Coaches must register at the Coaches' Registration table in person.

If a Coach does not have their accreditation tag, a temporary tag will be provided and a fine of \$20.00 will be assessed and paid immediately. If a Coach has an expired accreditation card, that Coach will not be allowed access to the coaching area.

**Please note that only one Coach per entry will be accredited and allowed at the ice level.**

SCNB Fall Skate: **Must be a minimum of Regional Trained in good standing.**

## **5. Refunds, Exhibitions and Skating Up**

---

Entry fees shall be refunded only if the event is not held or if the entry is withdrawn before the date of closing of entries.

If only one skater is entered in a category (single entry), that skater has the option to compete in the next highest category (if possible), skate an exhibition or withdraw from the competition. The LOC will contact the skater and the skater will have 48 hrs to convey their decision back to the LOC and this decision shall be final. If an answer is not received, the category will be cancelled.

At the discretion of the technical representative, if there are fewer than three participants in a category with age divisions, this category may be combined with the same level of category with a different age division.

Skaters wishing to skate an exhibition will be charged the regular skating fee. This fee will include feedback from the judging panel via a detailed sheet. No medals are awarded for exhibition skates.

## **6. Planned Program Sheet and Music**

---

Music – MP3 file **must** be submitted with the registration form.

- USB keys with music will not be picked up at Registration but they **MUST** be readily available during the competition (eg coach should have it on their person)

PLANNED PROGRAM SHEETS FOR ALL FREE SKATE EVENTS EXCEPT STAR 4 MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE.

- Deadline to submit the online planned program sheet is Friday October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021
- To complete the form, please use the proper codes. [CLICK HERE](#) for codes.
- There will be a \$20 fee charged for failing to submit the form.
- Improperly filling may entail a \$20 charge.
- Skaters will not be permitted to register at the competition until this fee has been paid.
- Planned program sheets will not be accepted at Registration.

## 7. Marking and Awards

---

- STAR 4 will be assessed and ranked.
  - Skaters placing 1st, 2nd and 3rd will receive medals.
- All other categories will be marked using the CPC Scoring system.

Results will be posted online.

Medals will be presented to the top three places in each event. In the case of only two entries, each entry shall be awarded a prize. In the case of only one entry in an event, an exhibition skate shall be performed but no prize shall be awarded. The medal presentation will take place in a designated area.

## 8. Protests

---

### [SC Competition Rule 3.14](#)

Decisions of the officials categorized as field of play may not be protested.

Protests regarding the following must be made in writing before the start of the event:

- Composition of the committee organizing the competition or the panels of officials, in cases where the rules of Skate Canada have been contravened.
- Eligibility of a competitor
- Objections to the participation of a competitor

If an immediate decision cannot be reached regarding the latter two points, the competitor(s) under discussion will be permitted to compete but if that competitor(s) qualifies for a prize, the announcement of the result and the distribution of prizes will be deferred until a decision has been reached.

### Informal Clarification of Field of Play Decisions

All informal requests for clarification of decisions of the officials categorized as “field of play” must be filed with the technical representative of the competition. The technical representative will coordinate the most appropriate mechanism for the Technical Controller or Referee (as appropriate) to provide feedback to the questions. Such informal requests may be made by the competitor(s), the coach of the competitor(s), club of the competitor(s), Skate Canada, or the team leader for the competitor(s), or any official of the competition.

#### Time Limits for Filing of an Official Protest

All protests regarding the determination of the result for a competitor(s) in the competition must be filed immediately after, but within no more than one hour of the posting of the full and detailed results for the Segment in question.

The Chief Data Specialist for the competition will attest to the time at which the full and detailed results have been posted.

No protest filed after the maximum allowed time will be accepted or considered.

## 9. Dressing/Change Rooms

---

The safety and protection of our participants is important.

SCNB adheres to Skate Canada's National Safe Sport Program as a means to help protect its participants from physical abuse, sexual abuse and other types of misconduct, including emotional abuse, bullying, threats, harassment, and hazing. To help prevent abuse or misconduct from occurring in dressing/change rooms, SCNB has adopted the following dressing/change rooms policy at competitions. This policy is designed to maintain personal privacy as well as to reduce the risk of misconduct in dressing/change rooms.

- Assigned at registration
  - Girl/Women or All-gender
  - Boy/Men or All-gender
- All dressing/change rooms doors are required to remain open.
- A hall monitor will be in place. Only accredited people (coaches, skaters, parents/guardians (if needed), and volunteers) will have access to the dressing/change rooms area.
- Cell phones and other mobile devices with recording capabilities, including voice recording, still cameras, and video cameras, are not permitted to be used in the dressing/change rooms. If cell phones or other mobile devices must be used, they are to be taken outside of the dressing/change rooms.
- If necessary, a maximum of one parent/guardian will be allowed in the dressing/change rooms. If a skater needs assistance with their uniform or gear, if the skater is or may be injured, or a skater's disability warrants assistance, then we ask that parents/guardians to let the coach know beforehand so they can properly assist their skater.
- SCNB prohibits all types of physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, bullying, threats, harassment, and hazing, all as described in Skate Canada's National Safe Sport Program. Participants, coaches, parents/guardians and volunteers may be subject to disciplinary action for violation of these dressing room policies or for engaging in any misconduct or abuse or that violates the Safe Sport Policies. Reports of any actual or suspected misconduct, must be reported to Skate-Safe.ca.

## 10. Camera and Video

---

Skate Canada NB will enforce the following:

Spectators are only permitted to use cameras and video at the event for personal use (for their child only);

- **No flash photography is allowed;**
- Any resale of photography is strictly prohibited;
- Any electronic devices are prohibited in the dressing rooms.

## **11. Accidents / Liability**

---

Skate Canada, Skate Canada NB, and the Club undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in all competitions, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Section, the Club and against their officers and their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

## **12. Tickets**

---

An admission fee may be charged. Competitors and coaches will not be charged an admission fee.

Senior Women	No age requirement
Senior Men	No age requirement
